An active student affairs department regularly keeps the parents updated on their children's progress and are called for meetings with the teachers to address any concerns / queries on their part. Regular feedback from the students by the Department of QEC allows us to improve the standard of curriculum delivery and points out any deficiency on the part of the faculty/administration. Students of RCD are supported by a state-of-the-art General Hospital (RMI) where the students get exposure to a myriad of diseases which are of concerns for the dental graduates as well. They are taught and trained by a team of qualified and experienced consultants of RMI.

## **BACHELOR IN DENTAL SURGERY (BDS)**

The course is paired with diverse clinical experiences and research and scholarly opportunities, providing students with knowledge and skills needed to be practice-ready after graduation. The students will also develop an appreciation for continual learning and improvement throughout their careers, setting them up for success in one of the most rapidly advancing healthcare sectors. The Phantom Head Laboratory and Clinical Skills Centre train students utilizing customized models, mannequins, simulated patients, and other training materials.

Thorough clinical experience is a characteristic of Rehman College of Dentistry's BDS program. The diversity of patients in clinics allows unmatched opportunities for hands-on experience in treating patients. Because of the high volume of patients, clinical students work closely with them, building long-term doctor-patient relationships.

Research is an integral part of RCD, and it has a well-established research unit headed by PhD faculty. The unit functions smoothly and maintains high quality to promote and facilitate research at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels. The Research Unit is involved in teaching research curriculum for all four years of BDS. Regular seminars and an annual Research and Innovation Summit and International Conference with multiple relevant activities allow students and faculty to develop linkages and collaboration with the dental community across the country.

To enhance the research culture, RCD launched its official peerreviewed journal, JRCD, which has been publishing quality research since 2020 and is in the process of indexation. An intensive internal assessment program by the QEC enables the evaluation of student competence.

## **ADMISSION POLICY**

The following Admission Policy is formulated in compliance with the provisions of Section 17(3) of Pakistan Medical & Dental Council Act 2022 dated 16-1-2023 and PM&DC Medical and Dental Undergraduate Education (Admission, Curriculum and Conduct) Regulations 2023-24 dated 13-07-2023 for admission of students to Rehman Medical College, Peshawar for MBBS course.

Applicability: This policy is applicable for the admission 2023-24

### **Eligibility Criteria**

#### Pakistani Student

Any person seeking admission to RMDC, Peshawar shall be eligible having fulfilled the following mandatory criteria.

- Passed valid MDCAT examination conducted by the Provincial Testing Authority under PM&DC Admission Regulation with a minimum score of 50% marks.
- Obtained a Higher Secondary School Certificate gualification ("HSSC") or an equivalent 12th grade qualification recognized in Pakistan and having obtained sixty percent (60%) marks therein, or a higher/lower percentage as may be notified by the PM&DC; and
- Passed the subjects of biology and chemistry and either physics or mathematics in the examination of the Higher Secondary School Certificate or an equivalent 12th grade qualification recognized in Pakistan.

### Foreign/Overseas Quota Seats

- Mandatory requirement of MDCAT shall not be applied to foreign, overseas Pakistani. Foreign students, overseas/ dual nationality holder shall qualify SAT-II with minimum 550 score in each subject OR foreign MCAT OR UCAT exam with 50% marks in the subjects prescribed under III above.
- Candidates holding permanent foreign nationality or dual nationality or overseas Pakistan who studies and passed HSCC 12 grade examination or equivalent from outside Pakistan and stayed in the foreign country for whole duration of the above-mentioned course on a permanent residence permit shall be eligible.

**Note:** IBCC Equivalent Certificate must be presented by both Pakistani and Foreign candidates in case of any qualifications passed from a foreign examination body.

#### Merit List

- The admission to BDS, shall be made strictly based on merit.
- In case final merit of more than one candidate is equal up to four decimals, the candidate older in age shall stand higher in merit;
- After the display of final list, if there is any vacant seat, next student on merit in the waiting list will be offered admission against such vacant seat.

#### Admission Process

- The applications through online portal of the college shall be accepted for the scrutiny and merit formulation as per PM&DC Medical and Dental Undergraduate Education (Admissions, Curriculum and Conduct) Regulations 2023.
- It will be the responsibility of the candidate to provide passed MDCAT/SAT II/MCAT/UCAT and HSSC or equivalent examination results prior to the last date of admissions as specified on the College website.
- The applicants shall be bound to provide the following documents through the college website by uploading the documents:
- SSC Marks sheet / IBCC certificate
- b. HSSC Marks sheet / IBCC (once available)
- MDCAT/ SAT II/MCAT/UCAT result (once available)
- Domicile certificate d
- CNIC / Form 'B' of Applicant and Father
- Passport size photograph
- Passport copy (Foreign applicants)
- Permanent residence permit (for foreign applicants)
- Certificate from the Institution last attended regarding study of SSC or equivalent.

- A student when accepting admission shall be under an obligation to disclose to the college if a prior admission has been accepted by them to any other college, and such student shall prior to accepting such later admission must in writing inform the prior college of cancellation of their acceptance with a copy to the designated email of the Authority. Failure by a student to cancel the prior acceptance of admission shall render all admission offers of the student as void and the student shall be ineligible for admission.
- It is the responsibility of all applicants to visit the website https://rmc.rmi.edu.pk/ for updated information.
- Communication to the applicants will be strictly through Email address provided by the applicant. Candidates must therefore provide their valid email id.
- A student may apply for admission after having taken the MDCAT or HSSC or equivalent 12th grade qualification exam subject to the requisite results being available & provided by the student to the college prior to deadline failing which the application will not be considered for current year admission
- Admission Offer will be treated as provisional & conditional subject to deposit of fee within stipulated time (03 working days), verification of documents and medical fitness.
- All selected applicants and their parents/guardian shall be bound to submit an affidavit/undertaking on a Rs. 100/- stamp paper duly notarized by a notary, stating the acceptance of College required disciplinary, legal, financial responsibilities and all other rules and regulations specified in the college prospectus.

### Payment of College Fee

- The selected Pakistani applicants shall be bound to deposit fee within three working days failing which the admission offer shall automatically stand withdrawn and next candidate on merit will be issued admission offer.
- The selected Foreign/overseas Pakistani applicants shall be bound to deposit fee within three working days in foreign exchange rate failing which the admission offer shall automatically stand withdrawn and next candidate on merit will be issued admission offer.
- The Pakistani student has the right to opt the payment of the fee on a quarterly, six monthly or annual basis to the college. A student paying the college on a sixmonthly basis in advance shall be granted a two percent discount in the tuition fee and a student paying the college on an annual basis in advance shall be granted a four percent discount in the tuition fee provided the fee is paid within the stipulated period failing which the option will be considered null & void.
- For subsequent professional years, if a student fails to deposit the fee/dues within the stipulated period, the following will be the penalty:
- Rs 300 per day for the 1st 10 days' delay
- Rs 1000 per day for the next 10 days
- After expiry of the said period with the fine mentioned in 3 above, the Principal is empowered to debar the student from classes, ban to avail any sort of college

facilities including internet, zoom, share point, online classes and library as well as appearing in the examinations. Meanwhile, the Principal will initiate disciplinary proceedings against the defaulter by serving notice of removal from the college to the defaulting student and their guardians. After completing all legal formalities including providing opportunity of being heard, final outcome to be communicated duly endorsed to all concerned departments and student will be liable to be expelled in light of Clause 9 sub clause 6 of PM&DC Admission Regulation 2023-24.

- if a student after having obtained admission seeks either to leave the program/college or transfer to other college in the middle of the academic session, the college shall have the right to adjust the tuition fee already paid on prorate basis along with penalty up to 10% in terms of Clause 9 sub clause 7 of PM&DC Admission Regulation 2023-24.
- All government taxes, University charges, regulatory body charges will be charged to the student on actual basis subject to change by the concerned authority from time to time.

### **General Provisions**

- PM&DC directives regarding admissions 2023–24 issued from time to time will be followed/adhered to.
- The admission policy should be read in conjunction with college prospectus and other disciplinary rules and regulations.
- A strict NO DONATION POLICY is adopted. No one except, Office of Admissions is authorized to give a written admission offer.
- Fee for more than one (1) year will not be demanded/accepted.
- All fees will be deposited in the official designated bank account.
- SCHOLARSHIPS: As per institution's past practices, scholarships will be offered as per policy to the deserving students on need basis subject to fulfillment of all codal formalities in terms of PM&DC Accreditation and Recognition Regulations
- Foreign/Overseas/Dual nationality holder: Keeping in view the current conversion rate of USD into PKR & discount facility mentioned in E(3) above, the students will be facilitated by offering special discount @ 50% to Overseas/Dual nationality-Pakistani student & 30% to Foreign nationals provided the student will have to deposit the fee on annual basis.
